While we are incredibly proud of Mr. Davies and thrilled for him as he takes this well-deserved step forward in his career, we are also saddened to be saying goodbye to such a dedicated and inspiring teacher. His positive impact on our school community, both in and out of the classroom, has been truly exceptional, and he will be greatly missed by us all.

To ensure a smooth transition, I am pleased to inform you that Miss Bowring will take on the role of Year 4 teacher (she is returning from her Welsh Sabbatical in the summer term) following Mr. Davies' departure after Easter. Additionally, for continuity and stability, Mrs. Griffiths will continue in the Nursery class covering Mrs. Williams' maternity leave. It also means we are able to keep Miss. Lois Evans, who has been a great addition to our Abbey family.

In relation to the important role of ALNCo, Miss. Lisa Dew has expressed an interest in becoming the Shadow ALNCo, and she will be working very closely over the next term with Mr. Davies to ensure a smooth transition in relation to ALN. In terms of a permanent replacement, that will need to be advertised internally during the next academic year.

She joins us having worked in Birchgrove's Specialist Teaching Facility. She is going to be a fantastic addition to our team whilst Miss. Richards enjoys the time with her new baby boy. Both Miss. On another note, I am thrilled to inform you all that Mrs. Kelly Harris (Mon & Tuesday), as well as Miss. Mollie Lambert (Wed, Thur & Fri) have been appointed as replacements for Miss. Carys

Hughes, who left the EYAC as a teaching assistant in October. We wish them well in their new positions too.

## **School Improvement Plan**

As part of our self-evaluation and monitoring processes, we have identified 4 areas for school improvement. The School Improvement Plan (SIP) is a statutory document which we work on developing over one, two or sometimes three years depending on the objectives.

We have four main priorities for 24/25 which we finalised last term. They are as follows:

## • School Improvement Objective 1:

To improve pupil attendance.

## • School Improvement Objective 2:

To ensure pedagogy allows nearly all pupils make effective progress in line with expectations of Curriculum for Wales by developing a shared understanding of progression.

## • School Improvement Objective 3:

To develop pupils mathematical and numeracy skills.

## • School Improvement Objective 4:

To develop pupils' creative writing skills

## **Mid-year Reports**

Mid-year reports will be distributed by teachers on **Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March at 3:30pm** via ClassDojo. A PDF document of your child's report will be sent and a link for feedback will be provided within the report like last year.

We received a huge amount of positive feedback from the way the reports were written and how supportive they were. We will be repeating this again this year, with an earlier summer term 'book look' for parents/carers to see the progress that has been made throughout the year.

## **Car Park and Parking**

The new car park is really working well with nearly all parents/carers abiding by the rules. Just a gentle reminder the drop-off zone is exactly that in the mornings...it is NOT a car parking space. In the afternoons, it can be used for parking as we have nobody being dropped off at that time. It is dangerous when cars park there and then children need to manoeuvre between cars to get safely to the pavement.

Our 'in' barrier to the staff car park is currently out of action due to damage from Storm Darragh. It is hopefully being fixed soon, but please can I ask parents not use it as an excuse to drop the children off outside the school door when late. The access to the staff car park is for **AUTHORISED** vehicles only. Diolch.

## **Premises**

The fencing along the staff car park has been amended with green mesh fencing which should prevent children climbing through and over the fence. The drop the other side of this fence from the gabion walls has caused me huge alarm, and I have raised these concerns with the local authority. They have agreed it is a huge risk and have sanctioned the fencing to be completed.

## St. David's Day

We will celebrate St. David's Day on **Friday 7<sup>th</sup> March**, with an Eisteddfod. Pupils are encouraged to wear traditional Welsh costumes OR red/white/green.
